

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Christmas 2020

King Herod instructed the wise men to go and search diligently for the Christ child. His motive was tainted but his instructions simple. We are told the same, from a pure motive, to go and search our world for signs of God among us, so that we can point out God to others. My prayer for all of us at St. Andrew's is to search high and low so that we might not overlook God right under our noses. Merry Christmas family of St. Andrew's! God has come, let us all rejoice. So much about this year was impacted by COVID, many of our regular activities have been altered. No matter our situation God continues to come into our world in large and small ways. Christmas is a time that we intentionally gather around the manager to hear and tell the story of God-with-us once again. Now it is our turn to join the shepherds to leave the manger and tell others that God has come.

Looking Back

We were not able to offer the traditional Christmas offerings of St. Andrews. This year has forced us "out of the box." I happen to think we have met the challenges of 2020 very well. COVID shut us out of the building and OMS imploded. The potential financial disaster that 2020 could have been, was avoided thanks to your faithfulness and willingness to try new ways to share God's love. We went outside, we went online, we had drive through and remote communion-through all of it, you offered your time, talents, and treasures. The words THANK YOU seem paltry. Jesus once said, "Well done, good and faithful servant." Servants of God at St. Andrew's, you have done 2020 very well!

This year to share the Christmas Story, we undertook a project we have never done before, a Living Nativity. For two

evenings in December over 40 volunteers took on roles portraying what the Christmas story may have looked like for visitors as they drove through three different scenes. We had about 100 carloads of visitors. Although we could not host in-person worship services the number of visitors to the Nativity was at least one full Christmas service. Our online Christmas services were both attended by about 40 connections. With most people participating online with 2 or more people in their homes, and most carloads at the nativity having more than one, this year our Christmas Services were the most attended in several years. To say this year has been overwhelming in both the work and the blessings, would be an understatement. We could not have pulled all this off without working together THANK YOU for your willingness to dive in and try something new.

Looking Ahead

We will continue to experiment with activities that raise both funds and friends. We will build on the successes of the Pumpkin Bash, the Produce Sale and the Living Nativity with movie nights, an online cooking class and some other surprising events. Thanks to some anonymous donors we have a new camera which will improve our online service experience. That upgrade will happen in the next few weeks.

There has been some interest in renting out the space previously occupied by the Montessori school. I am hopeful that one of the organizations that has reached out to us will continue on to occupancy. Please continue to pray for this possibility as the regular income is so very helpful to our financial wellbeing.




