FINANCIAL UPDATE

At the end of May 2021, (i) year-to-date contributions were 20% lower compared to 2019 (ii) we had already gone through half of the \$60,000 we had at the end of 2020 and (iii) we realized we would not be able to obtain a new large tenant to replace the Montessori School. This was an unsustainable financial situation.

What a difference six months has made. We sent out a plea to the congregation in June asking members to catch-up with or increase their giving and as is usually the case, you responded like gangbusters. Several members made large, one-time contributions, and regular weekly giving has since been running at high amounts. We've also received over \$40,000 of Employee Retention Tax Credits (ERTC, explained in November's Message).

As a result of the above and continued austerity measures, St. Andrew's now has over \$130,000 (and we expect to receive another \$10,000+ of ERTC). This is in addition to the combined \$100,000+ in the Memorial and Capital Expenditures Funds. This is particularly remarkable given that (i) we've been without a large tenant for more than a year (ii) the virus continues to have a negative impact on our ability to hold normal services and other church activities and (iii) many churches in our Synod are experiencing financial difficulty. We are in this strong financial position because of your undying financial support, the above and beyond efforts of Pastor Dave and an awful lot of "free" government money.

That being said, we will need to use and set aside a big chunk of the \$130,000. As explained last month, we may have to return up to two-thirds of the ERTC received. We are still without a large school tenant; and even if we obtain one, the school would not start until September 2022 and we probably would not start to receive a meaningful amount of rent until September 2023. And we may need to spend a large amount of money to make improvements to our space for any new tenant.

Because we now have so much money and since we need to set aside much of it for at least two years, Council has decided to invest up to \$32,500 (the amount of the ERTC subject to return) in a select group of diverse, "safe", high dividend paving stocks collectively yielding close to 6.0%, and \$10,000 in a US Treasury Series I Savings Bond with a current rate of 7.12%. The alternative would be to put the money in a bank savings account earning a mere 0.5%. We want to point out the amount invested in stocks is not money from member contributions but a portion of the "free" money received from the government (the ERTC and the forgiven \$30,000 PPP loan from 2020).

The ERTC for the fourth quarter has been eliminated by the \$1.2 trillion infrastructure law recently passed. The maximum ERTC we can receive is now \$53,000.

Maryel School Update

On Sunday November 28th the church council was excited to share with the congregation news about our potential renters. Celi and Juan Cacho are seeking to rent our space. Originally from Spain, where they opened their first school, Celi and Juan have a passion for education. They opened Maryel School of New York 9 years ago and are now looking to open a 2nd location in Westchester at our location. Maryel is a bi-lingual school for preK-5th graders, for students desiring fluency in English and Spanish upon completion.

The Maryel School will begin in September offering kids at the youngest levels and will add a grade level each year for the next 5 years. We have agreed upon a ten year lease which offers both the church and the school a great level of continuity. There is no substantial construction planned for our space at this time. The church is planning on installing a fire alarm and a new fence around the playground as part of the negotiation. Depending on the total cost of these items a congregational meeting to approve the expense may be needed.

Christmas Eve worship services will take place at 4 and 9pm. The early service will be super kid friendly. The later service complete with candlelight at Silent Night.

To get ready for these services we will be preparing a large banner for the sanctuary. This group art project will be available for you to join. It will be a "cut paper" banner. A simple but beautiful image of Christmas traced onto a large piece of paper with lots of shapes to cut out giving the banner a special look. All the materials will be ready before and after church in the Gathering Space Dec 5 and 12, it will be installed in the sanctuary on for worship on Dec 19th.

Advent Devotional Booklets are available on the back table of the sanctuary.

We have chosen to cancel the Drive Thru Nativity this year. A late start in planning, competition for volunteer times and the leadership time needed to secure our long-term renter has comminated in this requirement. These obstacles will be overcome next year.

Our Christmas light decorations are up and looking great. The manger scene has over 100 strings of lights

along with almost life-sized stat-uary of the holy family. Thank you to all the volunteers who have helped with this display!



Why do we shorten Christmas as Xmas?

Words change over time—their meaning, their usage, and even their spelling. Take Christmas and its shortened version, Xmas, for example. We see Xmas written nearly everywhere, from holiday advertisements to Christmas cards. The word Christmas comes from the combination of the words 'Christ' and 'mass.' But where did the X in Xmas come from, and what does it mean?

In the Greek alphabet, X is the symbol for the letter 'chi.' Chi (or X) is the first letter in the Greek word for Christ. In the early days of the Christian church, Christians used the letter X as a secret symbol to indicate their membership in the church to others.

If you know the Greek meaning of X, Xmas and Christmas essentially mean the same thing: Christ + mas = Christmas.
