was clueless. I only knew that I didn't want to work for someone else, which left working for myself or working for God. I flirted with the former before diving into the pool of ministry headfirst. The Narrative Lectionary is a four-year cycle of readings. On the Sundays from September through May each year the texts follow the sweep of the biblical story, from Creation through the early Christian church. Each week will feature both a "primary text" and a gospel passage. The texts show the breadth and variety of voices within Scripture. They invite people to hear the stories of Abraham and Sarah, Moses and the prophets, Jesus, and Paul. Listening to the many different voices within Scripture enriches preaching and the life of faith." This year's we'll be moving through Year 3 which means we'll focus on the gospel of Luke in the Spring.
