



Financial

Capital Preservation Policy

We can't thank the congregation of St. Andrew's enough for their show of support and love of our church through their more than generous giving over the years. We have more money now than we've had in decades and the Council will continue to make every effort to be good stewards.

The Council amended the Capital Preservation Policy (the "CPP") at its February 2025 regular meeting. The CPP was adopted in 2018 to ensure St. Andrew's would have enough funds for its future financial needs.

At the time of the CPP's adoption in 2018, the only source of funds St. Andrew's had was the Memorial Fund (the "MF") which was in danger of being depleted. The amount of money available in the MF had decreased from \$135,000 in 2013 to \$77,000 at the end of 2017. The CPP established a Capital Expenditures Fund (the "CEF") to be used as the primary source of funds for capital expenditures instead of the MF to preserve the MF. Since the MF was our only source of funds at the time and since it was being used up, Council tasked the Memorial Committee with carrying out the CPP.

Let's fast forward 7 years to today. (i) The amount of money available in the MF has increased by more than \$60,000. (ii) The CEF, after funding several projects, has over \$35,000. (iii) We now have excess operating funds of more than \$50,000 as opposed to being in debt \$23,000 to the MF in 2018.

The CPP needed to be amended to reflect the above. We made two significant changes. (i) Council now needs to carry out the policy because we now have three sources of funds and the MF is no longer in danger of being used up. The Council thanks the Memorial Committee for its efforts. (ii) A section needed to be added to address the retention and use of our excess operating funds. Feel free to contact the church office if you wish to read the amended policy.

We still need to continue our efforts in building our capital. We are likely to face the need to fund several large capital projects in the not-too-distant future. We have a lot of property and three buildings with aging infrastructure.
